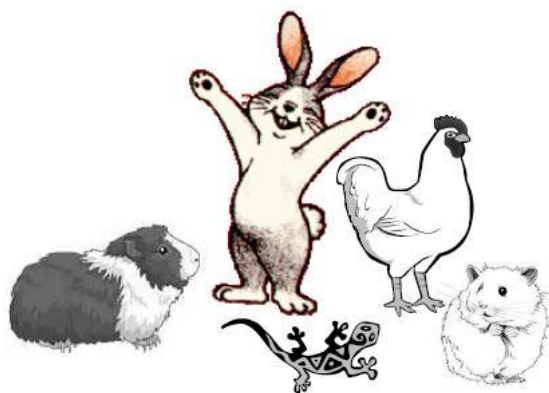

North Jersey Teen Conference “Lights, Camera, Leadership”

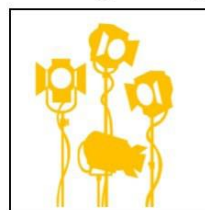
March 11-13, 2016

The NJ 4-H Goat Advisory Council, in cooperation with the New Jersey Junior Breeder Symposium is sponsoring a Sheep and Goat Video Contest and Film Festival. The film festival will be a part of the sheep and goat track of the Junior Breeder Livestock Symposium. **Entries are due March 7, 2016.**



Youth in grades 4-13 are eligible to participate and may work individually or as a team to create an educational video (3 minutes or less) about sheep and/or goats.

A selection of the videos will be shared at the film festival in the Round House at the Rutgers Cook Campus Farm during the final session of the Junior Breeder Livestock Symposium on Saturday, April 2, 2016 at 2pm.

Videos will be scored on educational value, creativity, clarity, pacing, and technical quality. The top three scoring videos will receive awards.

Public speaking is a skill that you will use your entire life! For example: Book reports and oral reports in school, college interviews, job interviews etc. Being able to communicate your thoughts to a group of people in an organized fashion takes practice! Lots of practice!

All 4-H members including Cloverbuds are encouraged to give a presentation!

TENTATIVE Presentation Dates and Locations

Tuesday, March 8 7-8:30 pm at Oxford Central School {no animals allowed} (maximum 20 presenters – approx. 5 per room)

Thursday, March 10 7-8:30 pm at 4-H Office (maximum 10 presenters)

Wednesday, March 16 7-8:30 pm at Oxford Central School {no animals allowed} (maximum 20 presenters – approx. 5 per room)

Tuesday, March 22 7-8:30 pm at 4-H Office (maximum 6 presenters)

If you are using a live animal in your presentation, please plan to present at the 4-H office as Oxford School will not allow animals.

Nights will be filled on a first come-first served basis so if you need a particular night, DO NOT wait until the last minute to turn in your registration form! **Registrations are due Wednesday, February 10, 2016. LATE registrations WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

Don't forget the new presentation time limits:

- 3-5 minutes for Cloverbud members
- 5-15 minutes for regular members (the more experienced you are at public speaking the longer you will be expected to talk – for example 1st time presenters will only be expected to speak for 5-6 minutes where-as a 9th year presenter will be expected to speak for 12-15 minutes.)
- 10-15 minutes for team presentations (team presentations are given in pairs. No more than 2 presenters can make up a team.)

County Level Requirements: If you plan to give a county level presentation to qualify for **ANY** State level 4-H event, the presentation **MUST** be given at the March presentation events! No other presentation dates will be accepted as county level for qualifying purposes.

News! 4HOnline Update

January 1, 2016 was the registration/“re-enrollment” deadline for State level 4-H events. All current 4-H members who wish to participate in a State level event **MUST** be registered in 4HOnline by January 1. If you did not register with 4HOnline or complete the re-enrollment process before January 1, you will not be eligible for events such as (but not limited to) NJ State Horse Bowl competition, State Presentations, State Rabbit, Cavy, and Small Animal Show, State Horse Show, etc.

New members can sign up for 4HOnline at <https://nj.4honline.com>.

Returning members need to “re-enroll” each fall with the start of the new project year. **Please make sure you have “reactivated” your membership for the 2015-2016 project year!**

Fortunately, the process is very simple. Just login to your Family account in 4HOnline. (If you’ve forgotten your password, you can request a new one on the program’s entry page.)

Once in, click the **Edit** button next to your name. Click the **Enroll for 2015-16** button at the bottom of the page. You’ll type/sign for the Code of Conduct and Media Release Policy. Click **Submit** and you’ll



be done. Your registration will then be confirmed by the club leader and accepted by county staff for the new program year.

Once you have been accepted at the county level, you cannot add or change your membership in current clubs. To add a club, delete a club, or switch from one club to another during the project year, you will need to contact the 4-H staff in the county office!
