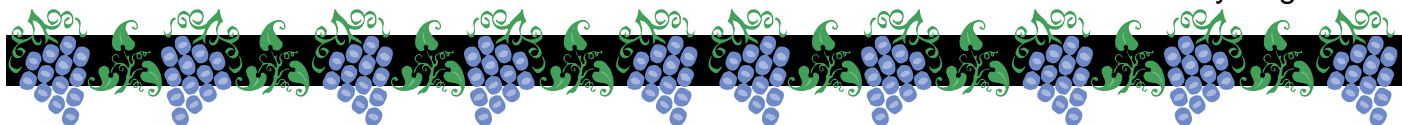

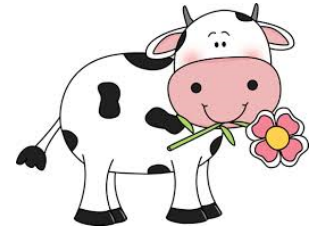

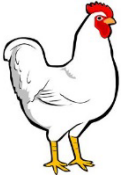

Starting September 11, 2018

Would you know what to do if a disaster struck
your home? Your school? Your community? In the
chaotic aftermath of an emergency, who could
help until the professional responders arrive? Who
could be the first person on-scene to step up and
help? The answer: YOU!

Warren County 4-H will be holding
a MyPI (My Preparedness
Initiative) Disaster Preparedness
Training for Teens ages 13-19 on
Tuesday evenings this fall!



The class will be held at the 4-H office beginning
on September 11 and concluding on October 30
from 6-8:30pm.

The training utilizes the United States Department
of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency
Management Agency certified Teen CERT training
manual and covers Fire Safety, Light Search &
Rescue, Basic First Aid, Triage and setting up
medical treatment areas, decision making and
communication skills as well as developing an
emergency supply kit and family communication
plan.

This course also offers full CPR & AED
certification! This part of the course will take place
on a Saturday in late September or Early October.
Details are still being finalized with the CPR
instructor.

10am – 3pm

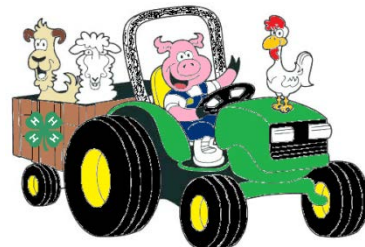
The Warren County 4-H Office in conjunction with

TBA).

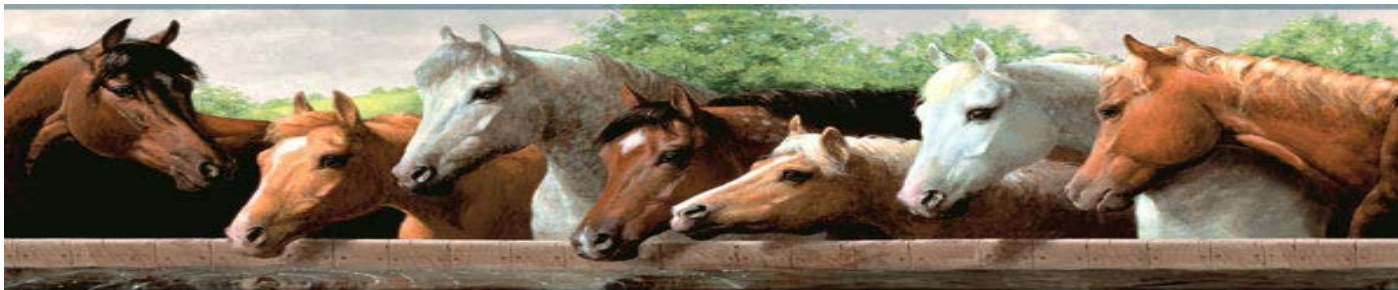
4-H Clubs are invited to come and set up an

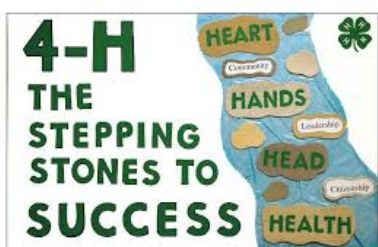
